

English Language 4 – Psychology

Face2Face - **Intermediate** Student's Book – Units 7-12

Vocabulary – Computers, electrical equipment; use of articles: a, an, the, no article; being polite; weather; containers; word formation: prefixes and opposites, other prefixes and suffixes; health; news collocations; connecting words: although, even though, despite, in spite of, however, etc. Health problems; Contacting people; Describing people; Phrasal verbs; Asking for, giving and refusing permission; Things people do at work; Adjectives to describe jobs; Verb patterns: reporting verbs; Checking information; Informal words and phrases; Phrases with *get*; Word formation: word families.

Grammar – Ability: be able to, manage, have no idea how, be good at, etc. Second conditional; Indirect and direct questions; the passive; Quantifiers: a bit of, too much/many, enough, plenty of, etc. Relative clauses with *who*, *that*, *which*, *whose*, *where* and *when*; Present Perfect Simple active and passive for recent events; Was/were going to, was/were supposed to; Modal verbs: making deductions; Reported speech: sentences, questions, requests and imperatives; Wishes; Third conditional.

Texts: *Virus writers*, *Global warming and climate change*, *Saving Jesse's Arm*, *Just Juice*, *Catch Me If You Can*, *For Better, for worse*, *Undercover's success is no secret*, *The Real Spider-Man*. Selected texts related to profession. Themes: Process of learning, Psychological development of the individual, Skills of expression, Developing love toward profession, Creative working atmosphere, Motivation, etc.
